Today's Reading

August 31, 2025 New International Version

First Reading Proverbs 25: 2 – 10

Introduction: These are proverbs written by King Solomon, son of King David. Many of these wisdom sayings describe a particular character trait, humility.

- ² It is the glory of God to conceal a matter; to search out a matter is the glory of kings.
- ³ As the heavens are high and the earth is deep, so the hearts of kings are unsearchable.
- ⁴Remove the dross from the silver, and a silversmith can produce a vessel;
- ⁵ remove wicked officials from the king's presence, and his throne will be established through righteousness.
- ⁶ Do not exalt yourself in the king's presence, and do not claim a place among his great men;
- ⁷ it is better for him to say to you, "Come up here," than for him to humiliate you before his nobles.

What you have seen with your eyes

⁸ do not bring hastily to court,

for what will you do in the end

if your neighbor puts you to shame?

- ⁹ If you take your neighbor to court, do not betray another's confidence,
- ¹⁰ or the one who hears it may shame you and the charge against you will stand.

Psalm 131 (Read in Unison - Cong. in Bold)

Introduction: With Humility – we look to the Lord as the source of our hope and peace.

 My heart is not proud, LORD, my eyes are not haughty;
 I do not concern myself with great matters or things too wonderful for me.
 But I have calmed and quieted myself, I am like a weaned child with its mother; like a weaned child I am content.

³ Israel, put your hope in the LORD both now and forevermore.

Second Reading Hebrews 13: 1 – 17

Introduction: Although the writer is unknown, it is speculated to be either Barnabas or Apollos, both Jewish Christians. These verses are great advice for Christian living.

Keep on loving one another as brothers and sisters. ² Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it. ³ Continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated as if you yourselves were suffering.

⁴ Marriage should be honored by all, and the marriage bed kept pure, for God will judge the adulterer and all the sexually immoral. ⁵ Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said,

"Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."

⁹ Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teachings. It is good for our hearts to be strengthened by grace, not by eating ceremonial foods, which is of no benefit to those who do so. ¹⁰ We have an altar from which those who minister at the tabernacle have no right to eat. ¹¹ The high priest carries the blood of animals into the Most Holy Place as a sin offering, but the bodies are burned outside the camp. ¹² And so Jesus also suffered outside the city gate to make the people holy through his own blood. ¹³ Let us, then, go to him outside the camp, bearing the disgrace he bore. ¹⁴ For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come. ¹⁵ Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise—the fruit of lips that openly profess his name. ¹⁶ And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased. ¹⁷ Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you.

⁶ So we say with confidence, "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can mere mortals do to me?"

⁷Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. ⁸ Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.




